Donate Non-Perishable Food Items

Starting **November 9**, drop off donations Monday–Friday, from 9 am to 4 pm in the main lobby of Eliot-Hine Middle School at 1830 Constitution Avenue NE (call the front desk for access if needed: (202) 939-5380). *Masks are required during delivery.*

- Personal hygiene items like toothpaste, tampons and feminine products, deodorant, soap, hand sanitizer

- Pineapple
- Mixed fruit

- Canned chicken
