



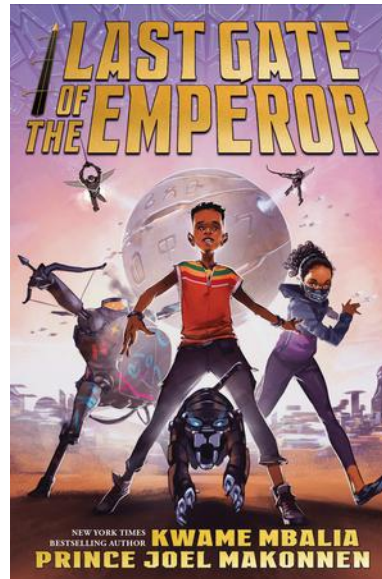

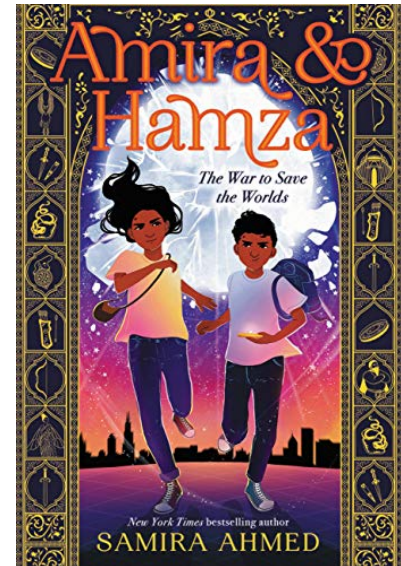
Middle Reader: Fantasy & Sci-Fi

An adventure-filled space romp of techy survival and both true and found family.



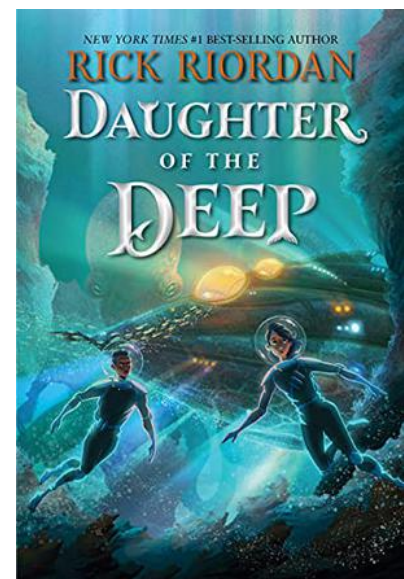
A fantasy quest with two nerdy, hilarious, bickering siblings intertwining Islamic legend and history.

Rick Riordan is back with a twisty and fresh new take inspired by *20,000 Leagues Under the Sea*.



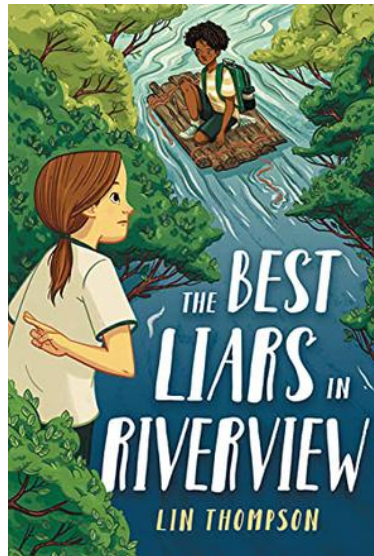

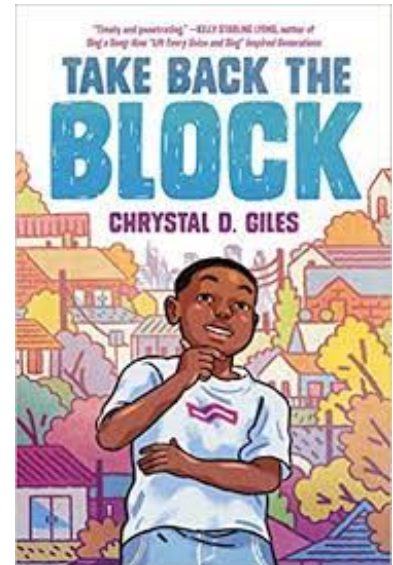

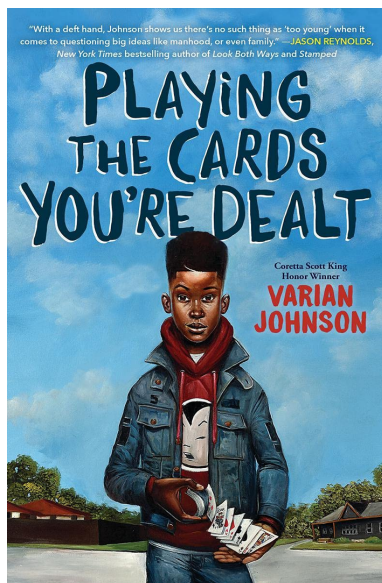
A hilarious graphic memoir about finding your place - no matter how many disasters it takes!

A sports mystery about attempting to uncover a buried family crime that may have been a set-up.



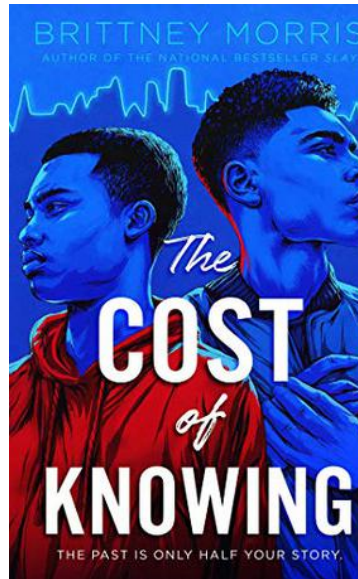

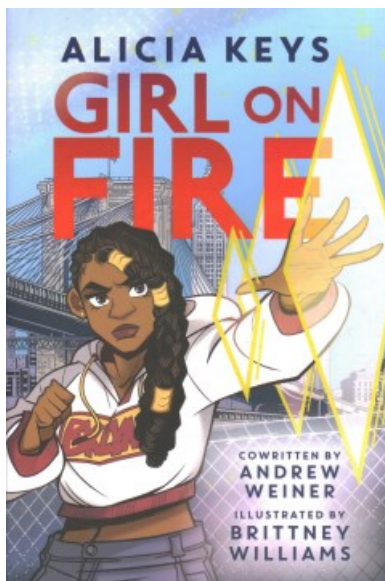
